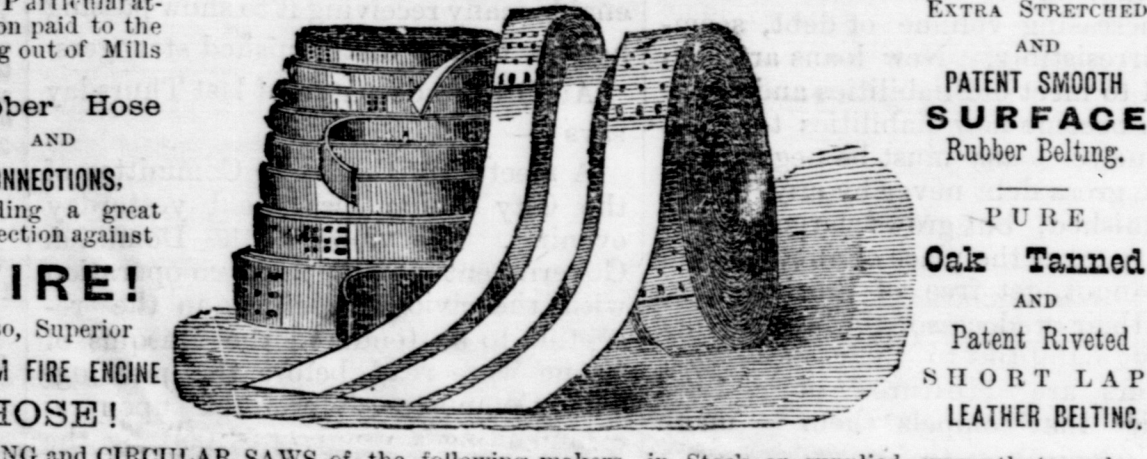

The McCarthy Mys. On Tuesday of last week the trial of the Osbornes, commenced at 11 o'clock.

Osborne were arraigned, charged with the murder of Timothy McCarthy, before Chief Justice Allan. H. Eliza together with their mother.

On Wednesday the Court opened at 10 o'clock and a considerable time was occupied in challenging jurors.

The indictment was then read by the Clerk after which Hon. D. L. Hanington opened the case for the Crown.

On Thursday the Court opened at 10 o'clock. The trial of John Osborne was renewed.

Daniel White was the first witness called for the prosecution, his evidence was much the same as that given at the July trial.

Philip Vautour corroborated the evidence of previous witnesses without giving any new facts.

At the afternoon Session Stephen McCarthy, brother of the deceased, was examined, but his evidence did not contain any new facts.

His Honor thought witness said no one at the former trial. The question was put and answered in the negative.

Witness said he was nothing like as old looking as Dr. Tuck. He seemed about 20 or 27.

Coroner Hanington was up on the stand Saturday morning, and described the appearance of McCarthy's body after it was taken from the river.
