

Socialism is nothing more than "paternal government." Carried to its logical results. The same principal which invokes the aid of government to foster distressed industries at the expense of the consumer, if carried out a little further in the same direction, would call upon society to suppress property for the benefit of the men who toil. Our high and dry Protectionists will feel angry at being represented as having anything in com mon with those abominable Socialists, but the Saturday Review shows us exactly where they stand, and any amount of fretting and fuming will not alter their position. And, after all, it is not the first, nor will it be the last time, that extremes have been known-unconsciously per-
