The Equine Wonders at the Aqua-

The current attraction at the Aquarium is of more than general public interest. It consists of a troupe of ten Broncho horses, whose evolutions constitute a genuine novelty. The fascination which pertains to ordinary circus performances has been heightened in this instance by the adoption of a novel and ingenious plan. Briefly stated, it is to present an equestrian entertainment divested of the mere mechanism of the "ring." Extraneous aids are disregarded. The horses appear without riders. They are neither "checked," driven or directed, but perform evolutions which are wholly the result of training, and perform them without assistance.

These horses were originally wild on the plains, and have undergone all stages of subjection until they are now under complete control. To what extent they may be carried is shown in some of their marvelous feats. The horses first execute a military drill, forming into line, answering the roll-call and marching in single and double file, and in platoon, counter-marching and executing other martial tactics. A handkerchief is passed along the entire line from mouth. At the conclusion of this, Picconina, who is perhaps the most spirited of the ten, compels the others to leave the ring in successive order, without a word of direction or assistance being uttered by any one. Then two horses open a lid of a box and find a handkerchief concealed therein, which is delivered to the owner. One horse makes choice among flags of different colors, such ones as the audience select, and afterward leaps through a burning hoop. Another animal fires off a pistol from a sack strapped at his flank, and still another unties with its teeth a handkerchief tied alternately on one of his fore and hind feet. But the most difficult trick accomplished is the act of "seesawing." A horse mounts a plank oscillating on a fulcrum, and, although the board is scarcely two feet in width, balances himself in the centre until it reaches a horizontal position. When he has the plank completely at rest, he inclines toward one end, and by letting the other fall, enable a second horse to mount. The equilibrium is again established, and for some time the two horses "see-saw" in the most approved style. They then change places without leaving the plank, and finally dismount separately.

The horse Flora rolls a barrel up an inclined plane—a most difficult feat, for the hoofs of the animal are so constituted as to render impossible any grip on the substance. But more difficult still than this is the precess of rolling the barrel down the plank. Nettle is the chief leaper of the

Broncho troupe, clearing four horses and a fence at a bound. All of these horses are of great strength and grace of movement, and under most perfect training. Their exhibitions are a real novelty, and amply repay a visit to the Aquarium.

The attractions of the place are likewise enhanced by a troupe of educated dogs. A dog's pantomime of the drollest description is enacted. One dog steals a brass collar from another; a third one goes in pursuit of the offender and overtakes him. Meanwhile, a noose has been slipped around his head. Two other dogs erect a gallows. The dog who has hold of the end of the noose. draws the thief after him, and, by jumping over the cross-bar of the gallows, is enabled to pull the rope taut, and thus raise the offender from the ground. The thief is then let down, to all appearance dead. Three dogs bring a wagon for a hearse. The dead criminal is deposited therein, and the funeral cortege proceeds from the place of execution, while the brass collar is restored to its rightful owner. The intelligence shown by these dogs is surprising. -New York Star.

FIELD-GUNS FOR THE ENGLISH ARMY. -The new 12-pounder field gun, which may be considered as the product of two years' experiment, was recently completed at the Royal Gun Factories, Royal Arsenal, Woolwich, and is looked upon by British officers as the most perfect field-gun in existence. At present it is proposed to make only 50 on the same pattern, and those only after the sample gun is finally approved, but no doubt exists that it will hereafter become the service arm of the entire artillery force. The most noticeable feature in its outward form is its length, for it is nearly nine feet long, whereas the 9-pounder of 8 hundredweight measures but 6 feet. The new 12-pounder however, weighs only 71 hundredweight, for every ounce of superfluous metal has been judiciously shaved off, and save that the contour of the breech end is a little too rigid, the gun is, from a professional point of view, the beau ideal of a field piece. The bore like that of the 9-pounder, is 3-inch calibre, enlarged at the chamber end to 3.15 inches, and the vent is fixed rather forward to ignite the catridge seven inches from the bottom of the bore. Sights of the most delicate, serviceable, and approved kind have been provided, and an improvement of the trunnians is also introduced in this gun. The improvement consists of a collar on each arm to brace up the carriage and save it from some of the damaging effects which it suffers from the shock of discharge. The gun is rifled in ten grooves the rifing, like every other detail, having been the result of long investigation and exhaustive series of experiments.

THE TELEPHONE AND PHONOGRAPH. -The world has not ceased wondering ft. the feats of Prof. Bell's telephone in conveying the human voice a hundred miles, when it is startled by another and greater wonder, an invention of Mr. Edison's that records the utterance of the voice and repeats them with marvellous exactness. It will talk, sing, sneeze, whistle, cough. The instrument is most simple. The operator talks with a mouth piece. Back of the mouth piece is a vibrating disk made of tin. Against this disk is a fine steel point held in place by a spring. This point vibrating with the disk makes fine indentations on a sheet of tin foil rolled around a cylinder. The cylinder is moved by a screw crank, which produce a spiral line of indentations in the tin foil. Thus, what the voice says is recorded on the tin foil. To make it talk, the crank is turned backwards, and a funnel like a speaking trumpet is attached to the mouth piece to keep the sounds from scattering.
