that the sum of \$25.00 for superintending men be struck out as contrary to Law.

Mr. Smith's account No. 49, passed as correct. It was ordered, that the amount of \$15.00 expended by Messrs. Morse & Smith on a criminal case be refunded.

A motion by Coun. Johnson that the account of the Commissioners for the Parish of Addington be ordered till July, and the Secretary to communicate with Attorney General on matters connected therewith was carried, as also the motion by Coun. Johnson that previous to appointment of Parish officers, the parishes in the County except Addington be divided into three districts for Highway purposes.

The petition of the Overseers of the Poor for \$4.00 expenses was thrown out. The Secretary was ordered to prepare a short Bye Law for the prevention of noxious weeds, thistles, &c., and also to look after the note of J. Phillips for hay and grass, and report in July.

Coun. Johnson then brought up Auctioneer matters, whereupon the Sec'y was ordered to notify all Auctioneers known, to pay their license or be subject to the fine. A communication from J. I. Fellows, Chf. Game Commissioner was read, concerning appointment of officers in different Parishes, and it was then resolved that the Deputy Game Wardens for the respective parishes be appointed as follows: Parish of Colborne, John R. Hamilton; Darburn, Robert Harvey; Dalhousie, John Harburt; Addington, Henry Duncan. Council then adjourned.

THE QUESTION OF GEORGE DUTCH BEING TAXED IN TWO PLACES, was brought up by Coun. Hamilton, and the Sec'y ordered to look into the School Law. J. F. Kenny, on payment of the sum of \$10, was granted an Auctioneer's License. The case of Wm. Barclay, who applied for Liquor License, was not taken up, and there being no petition a License was not granted.

The Parish Lists were next examined and passed as read, except the list for Durham, which was passed with a few corrections. David Sadler, acting as Auctioneer, was ordered to stand over till the 22nd. Council then adjourned.

WEDNESDAY, JAN. 22. Council met pursuant to adjournment, Warden in the Chair. It was ordered that the petition of Michael P. Doyle for Liquor License be held over till next morning. Coun. Hamilton reported on Mrs. Pike's claim, and it was found that it had been fully accounted for and paid over in Sheriff Phillips' account for 1877.

The case of J. S. Morse, was next taken up, and ordered to stand over till the 22nd. Council then adjourned.

THURSDAY, JAN. 23. Council met pursuant to adjournment, Warden in the Chair. It was ordered that the petition of Michael P. Doyle for Liquor License be held over till next morning. Moved and seconded that Mr. Morse's account as Clerk of the Peace stand over, and that question of salary disposed of be reconsidered, whereupon a debate ensued. It was moved and carried, that instead of special fees to the Clerk of the Peace for each service, there be paid to that officer the sum of \$30 with mileage when absent from Shirkton.

Mr. Morse's account was again taken up, and a discussion ensued as to the duties pertaining to the office of Clerk of the Peace, and moved that first item \$10 be allowed. 2nd item \$4.00, be thrown out, and 3rd item \$1.50 be paid, and the last two items be thrown out.—The account returned to \$11.65 was ordered to be paid. A number accounts were then passed, and Council adjourned.

Warden in the Chair. Wm. Barclay was heard in reference to tavern licenses. A number of accounts were passed, among which was an account of John Mair, Bye Road Commissioner. It was allowed to stand on complaint of John Dawson, and the Secretary ordered to notify Mr. Mair by telegram to appear before the Council.

The accounts of John M'Intosh, John M'Kinnon, Wm. Barclay, Jas. Fitzpatrick, Wm. D. Miller, John Cook and John Gard in which were some errors were then taken up, and after some debate allowed to pass, and a motion carried that Commissioners hereafter be supplied with proper forms &c. The account of Thor. Alexander, Commissioner of Highways, Parish of Colborne, was also passed, and Council adjourned.

THURSDAY, JAN. 23. Council met pursuant to adjournment, Warden in the Chair. John Kain, Collector of Dog Tax, was called to explain his actions. He was excused on account of not being able to obtain proper advice on the matter.—The supplementary report of Auditor W. S. Smith, Esq., was then read. John Mair, Bye Road Commissioner, on complaint of John Dawson, was called upon to explain his accounts to Council, when it was moved and carried that they be not passed as correct, but be specially referred to the effect that the Council look upon the system of paying more for work than the amount contracted as contrary to Law and evil in its tendencies, and that the Government be advised of the expression of this opinion by the Council. The Secretary was ordered to notify Commissioners of Highways, Parish of Addington, to be in attendance at 12 noon on 24th inst, and also to notify Overseers of Poor, Parish of Addington, to pay over \$12 to County Treasurer for general funds; also J. Hayes, Overseer of Poor, Durham, to pay over \$2.00 improperly retained.

Councilors Johnson, Moffat and Hamilton were appointed a Committee to examine and report on Sheriff's account No. 38, after which several accounts were passed in numerical order, and for billings in which the Elections of Councilors were held. Council adjourned.

FRIDAY, JAN. 24. Council met pursuant to adjournment, Warden in the Chair. The committee appointed to examine Sheriff's account reported and ordered that it be accepted as amended. A number of accounts were then taken up and dealt with. The Committee on account of James Campbell, Collector of Rates, Durham, recommended it to be paid. Commissioner Henderson and Overseer Sinclair being in Court, were called on to explain their accounts, and it was ordered that the sum of \$25.00 for superintending men be struck out as contrary to Law. Council which was passed and Council adjourned for dinner.

Mr. Smith's account No. 49, passed as correct. It was ordered, that the amount of \$15.00 expended by Messrs. Morse & Smith on a criminal case be refunded. A motion by Coun. Johnson that the account of the Commissioners for the Parish of Addington be ordered till July, and the Secretary to communicate with Attorney General on matters connected therewith was carried, as also the motion by Coun. Johnson that previous to appointment of Parish officers, the parishes in the County except Addington be divided into three districts for Highway purposes. A commissioner was to be specially appointed for each district, and that the Surveyors appointed in each such district report only to the Commissioner of that district.

The accounts of D. Ross, Overseer of the Poor, and Mr. Smith, as Auditor, were then passed, and a Committee was then ordered to adjust the accounts and returns of Collectors of Rates for the several parishes during the past year, and the several amounts they have paid to the County Treasurer, with a view of refunding any surplus paid. The petition of the Overseers of the Poor for \$4.00 expenses was thrown out. The Secretary was ordered to prepare a short Bye Law for the prevention of noxious weeds, thistles, &c., and also to look after the note of J. Phillips for hay and grass, and report in July.
