Miramichi Advance.

THE BUDGET DEBATE. We close our reports of the Budget debate at Ottawa with this issue of the ADVANCE, other important matters claiming attention. Hon. Isaac Burpee, who was received with cheers, said, after having the privilege of reading the Budget to the Lower Provinces, he was satisfied that every grave apprehension must exist in every right-thinking mind, that the Government of the Confederation should the present fiscal policy be continued for any length of time. He proceeded to refer to the increase which had taken place in the ordinary expenditure of the Dominion, and showed that while the controllable expenditure had been very considerably diminished during the administration of the late Government, it was now going up at an alarming rate, and this was all the more to be regretted because there was no reason why it should not be reduced to the minimum at which it could be maintained. The increase upon public works was accompanied by a corresponding increase in the ordinary expenditure, which had to be made good out of the revenues of the country. Receipts from customs, on which so much had been spent, were decreasing, and the tariff was not doing its duty. The Pacific Railway, when built, he ran at great loss to the country. Our debt was increasing to an alarming degree. The Government of New Brunswick was greatly increased by the tariff and the province paid three to four per cent. more proportionately than the other provinces.
