The London Timber Trades Journal of 9th inst. says:—When a parliamentary return is demanded and produced with a view to establish the working of an existing Act, or to ascertain its value in comparison of the previous state of the law, the facts produced are usually accepted as conclusive evidence as far as they go for or against the point at issue.

These men have swept away all political principles and opinions and exalted in their place that of the "Spills of Office." For these, they have wrangled and contended upon the floors of the Legislature for years, like a pack of half-starved and hungry wolves over a dead carcass in the forest. This statement is correct, has been shown by the bitter animosity with which certain members have, time and again, arraigned the Government for their unjust and illegal acts, as well as the wasteful, shameful manner in which they have long squandered the revenues of the Province upon themselves and their hungry followers in the House, and afterwards—when the chance was offered them—gone into that very same Government and helped to perpetrate the very evils that they had so fiercely and vehemently denounced a few short months or weeks before in the Legislature.

Let us now turn up the Debates of 1870-74 and read the speeches of Messrs. Hamington, Landry and Adams as if they wish to become acquainted with the language these honest, upright, patriotic gentlemen used when they denounced the Government, of which they now are members, for its corrupt practices as well as the wholesale manner in which its members squandered the revenues of the Province. Our own member—the upright, patriotic Hon. Michael Adams—could find no language strong enough to express his sentiments respecting the corruption and dishonesty of Messrs. Fraser and others. It is unnecessary for me to give the people of this county his former opinion of the Government he is now a member of, as they heard of it from himself in 1874-5 when he denounced its members as being worse than Alva Bala and his forty thieves, who lived, thrived and fattened upon the wholesale plunder of the people.

These men, political principle and consistency are nothing but sounding brass and tinkling cymbals, as, in their opinion, these virtues have long fled the country; but, if by accident, they meet with one who is a sincere believer in them, they look upon him as either behind the age or a blind visionary dreamer, more fit for an insane asylum than to give an opinion upon public affairs. They have anything but an abiding faith in the old maxim that "honesty is the best policy," as it is their opinion that the man who would not sacrifice the barren and unremunerative title of an honest, upright politician, to take stock in the Government, mine and thereby enjoy the "Spills of Office," is a contemptible fool for letting a good chance pass to pocket and not a few thousand dollars.
