The Poisoning of Wells.

It is probable that a large proportion of cases of disease in rural districts is the result of poison absorbed into the system either from the stomach or the lungs. The blood is manufactured in the digestive organs from the food, passes in great part through the liver, and all of it through the lungs, in both of which it is filtered and purified, and in the latter it is brought directly into contact with the air which is breathed by inspiration, and is subjected to any deleterious matter which may be contained in it. As the food and drink are the materials of which the blood is formed, any unhealthy or poisonous influence at this prime source, of course, poisons the stream; and as the function of the lungs is to aerate and purify the blood, anything wrong in the purifying material interferes with this important vital process.
