

Allan terms provided that the road was to be built and equipped according to the specifications to be hereafter agreed upon between the Government and the Company, and that the materials used in the construction and working of the railway, the capacity of the engines, and the character of the rolling stock should be regulated between the Governor in Council and the Company. There was not a word in the present contract-as there was in 1874 -that the work should be proceeded with upon the specifications of the Government. And so with regard to all the other provisions. Another very serious discrepancy was seen in the provision as to the stand. ard of the road.
