colors and gold. It was divided into three panels by pilasters bearing equilateral arches in dark mahogany color, the spans | The new central panel contained the sacred monoand silver. The quatre-foils contained the symbols for Christ Jesus, the Lord. banner having a scalloped border of gold filled with shilds bearing scrolls in dark brown and red bearing in white antique letters "Peace on earth, good will to men." White panels between the windows wreathed in hemlock bore in letters of cedar. "Of the increase of his government and peace, there shall be no end." The windows, doors, pulpit, lectern and prayer-desk, as well as the lamps, were wreathed in hemlock and moss and decorated with large clusters of scarlet berries.
