A recent cough almost always yield to the following treatment within two or Shake well. Dose for an adult, one to two teaspoonfuls every two or three hours. Half this quantity to children from ten to fifteen years. It is not safe to give it to infants or children under ten years of age. To stop bleeding; if from a cavity in the jaw after a tooth has been extracted, shape a cork into the proper form and size to cover the bleeding cavity, and long enough to be kept firmly to place when the mouth is closed. This, we believe is our own invention, and we have never known it to fail. It has served us in des-

When an artery is cut, the red blood spurts out at each pulsation. Press the wound and on the side toward the heart. Press hard enough to stop the bleeding, and wait till a physician comes. The wounded person is often able to do this himself, if he has the requisite knowledge. Simple fractures may be adjusted by almost anyone. Get the limb as nearly as possible in the natural position, and then send for the doctor. There is no

In case of poisoning, the simple rule is to get the poison out of the stomach as soon as possible. Mustard and salt act promptly as emetics, and they are always at hand. Stir a tablespoon in a glass of water and let the person swallow it quickly. If it does not cause vomiting in five minutes, repeat the dose. After vomiting, give the whites of two or three eggs, and send for the doctor.

Burns and scalds are soonest relieved cases, a physician should be sent for. -Hall's Journal of Health.
