The annual report of the Minister of Agriculture to Parliament contains a brief account of the lazaretto at Tracadie, New Brunswick, from the visiting physician of that institution.

The inmates of the lazaretto numbered twenty-two on the 31st of December last, eight of whom were males and fourteen females.

There was only one death during the year, and seven new patients were admitted. Among the patients who were admitted during 1874 was a young girl aged nine years, and, although admitted on the certificate of two physicians, when the institution was visited by Dr. Tache, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, some little time after she had been placed under treatment.
