The greatest enemy of human life in New York is long protracted heat. It kills of the children of the tenement houses as if by plague was upon us. If the thermometer keeps up continuously above eighty degrees, and especially if it rises into the nineties, the mortality is at once doubled, or nearly that. And about two-thirds of the deaths are among infants under five years of age.

Cholera, which formerly scourged the city on several occasions, is now almost unknown here. An efficient
