



The London Society of Telegraph Engineers and of Electricians have decided to offer annually three prizes for the best original papers on telegraphic or electric subjects, sent in by any persons not members of the council of the Society. The prizes will consist of scientific books or apparatus, the first prize having a value of £10 and the other two of £5 each. The first awards will be made for papers sent in before the end of May past.

Gas and electricity have combined to produce light in a new system. Vessels in the Atlantic near the Cape Verde archipelago occasionally encounter showers of fine dust, which so often have a reddish appearance that they are known to sailors as "red fogs." In Lyons, Genoa, Sicily and other parts of southern Europe similar phenomena give rise to "blood rains," of which Flammarion has collected a record of twenty cases occurring in Europe between 1803 and 1870. By microscopical examination Prof. Ehrenberg has found the Atlantic dust to be rich in infusorial forms belonging to the equatorial regions of South America.
