A report of th United States Naval Advisory Board just ssued, states that the United States navy has only twenty-one ships fit to float. () these, it is added, not half a dozen are fin to do anything in time of war except float. and that only on condition that they are kept out of range of the enemy. The majority of the Board report in favour of building at once forty-one ships in several classes, two of over 5,000 tons, to steam tifteen knots an hour; six of over 4.000 tons, to steam fourteen knots : thirteen o 3,500 tons, to steam thirteen knots : and a number of gunboats to steam ter knots. It is thought that the promotion of American shipbuilding is likely to be a leading subject of the approaching Tarif Convention. The American Protectionis says on this subject :- " In our opinion the Protectionist ship question will be the prominent topic. It is the complement of the productive system. We thus far have been able to reduce the manufacturing and ndustrial preponderance of England, and now must reduce her maritime preponderance. Our trade passes through Engand. ## A Financial Blunder.

"But, while Mr. Blake was thus careful Sir Leonard Tilley, as Finance Minister, was recently told that the law forbidding banks to make loans on their own stock was being violated .-He seems to have thought that in order to ascertain the correctness of the report, he must requ re full returns of the affairs of the Banks-even to the names of endorsers on notes discounted.-This and other most extraordinary demands of a circular issued by the Finance Department caused Bank stocks to fall and a loss of about half a

million of dollars to the public holding such stocks. Of course the Minister was obliged to withdraw his demands. and some one told him how to ask for what he wanted. This, however, will not make good the osses his blunder has caused and the ruin of some individuals thereby.

## Unnecessary Interference.

The regular Life Insurance Companies, some of which are none too safe, show great jealousy of such mutual organizations as the Royal Arcanum. which give insurance at honest rates, their expenses of management being very small. As the regulars could not compete successfully with the others, their managers appear to have applied to the monopolists' friends the Dominion Ministry, and their success, so far, has been good, as the following Ottawa despatch of 6th inst., indicates :-The Government will propose legislation next session compelling Mutual Benefit Societies to report to the Insurance Bureau here, and perbaps requiring a small deposit of securities with the

# Saved by Buctouche Deal Ends.

It has been asserted by certain authori ties and writers in the press that timber. laden vessels are especially dangerous at sea, simply because as a custom, they carry deckloads, the reason of which is that they are generally floaty enough to bear them, and stiff enough to almost require them; and we have shown in these columns that of all cargoes a customary timber cargo is the safest for a sailor to ship with. They may suffer from exposure and want of provisions as in any other vessel, but they cannot be lost by

the foundering of the ship as long as she holds together. We are always glad to

LAND SPECULATION in Winnipeg is not so lively as it was a few weeks ago.






