

Dr. Morselli, of Turin, has given some curious and interesting facts and statistics concerning suicides, from which it appears that the victims of selfdestruction are rapidly becoming more numerous in nearly all civilized countries. In France, for instance, during the quarter-century from 1827 to 1852 the annual number of suicides gradually increased from forty-eight to nearly eighty-three per million of inhabitants, and the number in later years is stated to be 150 per million. The causes which lead to suicide are of course variousclimate, religion, and family relations being conditions which exert a marked influence. Dr. Morselli finds that during the change from cold to heat inspring suicides are more numerous than at other seasons. Very curiously, suicides are more frequent everywhere during the first third of any month than in the second, and during the second third than in the last. Protestants are far more inclined to self-destruction than Catholic; men, than women; unmarried, than married; the young, than the old. Suicides are most frequent among brainworkers-such as professional men; soldiers ranking next. Drowning and hanging are most often the means em.
