

On Fox, Portage and other Islands at the mouth of the river may be found what one of the inhabitants in that locality called the Heather. Not unlike the "Bonny Heather Bell" the creeping Hudsonia has pretty yellow flowers, and these are said to only open for one day, the sands in places are literally covered with these plants.

It was found by the Arctic explorer Nordensgjold in the far North, and I have no doubt is plentiful in Norway and Sweden, for I recollect some Norwegian captains being highly delighted at finding some of these flowers by the Water Mill, Lower Mill Cove, some years ago, called often times the Twinflower -two flowers issuing from the flower stalk.
