

Thursday, 18th Jan. (Continued.) The Report of Newcastle Firewards was submitted as follows:-

REPORT OF NEWCASTLE FIREWARDS. Northumberland. The firewards of the town of Newcastle

beg leave to submit the following report,-We are pleased to state that our town has not been visited by any serious 1 ces. There were several alarms, only three o which were accompanied by any loss of property, viz., an old house known as the McBride house, a barn belonging to Mr. Alex. Atchison, in which the fire had gained so much headway before discovery that it was impossible to save it, and another the spool factory buildings belonging to Mr. M. Russell, which were burned on the 26th Dec. last. On the occasion of the last fire there was considerable diffi culty and delay in getting the steamer in a position to obtain water which could not be avoided under the circumstances. On being placed the engine did splendid work. fully maintaining its reputation as a well constructed and reliable piece of machinery. The engine is now in excellent condition. Early in December the Board

accepted the resignation of Rich'd Fairman and have appointed Robt. Beckwith in his place as engineer. The latter performs all the duties of his predecessor and is to live over the engine room and receives a salary of \$160 per annum and the use of the vacant rooms in the engine house.

During the past year the fire company with the exception of a few members appear to have lost interest in their duties and the Board have decided that a volunteer company is not at all times to be depended upon, and they would suggest that hereafter in case of fires the firewards should hire the best men available to passed work on the hose and pay them a certain

This would not prevent the public from assisting and would supply the firewards with men who would not be so apt to leave before the engine and hose are returned to the engine house. At the last meeting it was the unanimous opinion of the Board that the engine room is too small to contain both engine and hose reels. After considerable discussion it was decided that if a building were

erected alongside of the public landing at the public wharf in which the engine could be kept and under which a never failing supply of water from the river For Ladies' Ulsters and Jackets, Gents Overcoats could be had with a further supply of hose the engine could remain in the building and hose could be stretched to any part of the town so that for most fires the engine would not require to be moved at all and could be kept and worked to much greater advantage. From past experience we have no doubt that the eugine has sufficient power to send water through hose from this point to any building in the fire district. We would therefore request the Municipal Council to give this matter their best consideration and to give the Firewards of Newcastle the privilege of erect ing a suitable building at the slip which could be done without encroaching upon the rights of the public to said slip.
