

How the President is Elected. JOHNSON & CO., our readers at the present time. He is chosen by what is called an Electoral College, composed of delegates returned by each State in the Union. Each State selects by popular vote as many electors the several districts, and they would better express the wishes of the people

> which they are severally entitled, are as follows Alabama, 8 Nevada . 3 New Hampshire Colorado, 6 New Jersey. Delaware, . 3 New York. 4 North Carolina .. Florida 12 Ohio ... Georgia 13 Rhode Island. 9 South Carolina 6 Vermont. 14 West Virginia. Michigan .

The election is held on the Tuesday

next after the first Monday in November

in every fourth year. On the first Wednesday in December following, the electors chosen in each State meet at their respective State capitols and vote for President and Vice President by severa ballots. Each State college makes a list of the names voted for these offices, with the number of votes cast for each, which list the members of the college sign and certify. These lists are sent to the seat of Government, directed to the President, whose duty it is on the second Wednes day of the following February to open them and count the votes in the presence of the Senate and the House of Representatives. The persons having the greatest number of votes for the respective officer (if a majority of the whole) are then declared elected. If no candidate commands a c'ear majority, the House of Representatives chooses the one who have most votes. In the case of the Vice-President the Senate makes the choice. The President must be a rative of the United States. 35 years of age, and holds office for four years, beginning on March 4th, following the election. It will be seen that it does not necessarily follow that the successful candidates represent a majority of the whole popular vote. The majorities by which the electors, who have placed their candidates in office, are elected, may be much smaller in their respective States than those of the unsuccessful electors. For example, Maine and West Virginia have each six electoral votes. In 1880 the former elected the Republican ticket by a majority of about 9,000 votes, the latter the Democratic ticket by about 11, 000 majority. The two tickets, if cast solid in the electoral college, would have killed each other, although the Democrats had a majority of 2,000 in the popular vote of the two States. The State elections practically determine the political character of the vote for the President.
