and Ferrier, in a desperate hand-to-hand

tight, killed several of the enemy, drove

off the rest and enabled some others of our

men, who afterwards came up to carry off

the wounded officer. On the same day

and about the same time, Private Fowlis,

of the military train, was unhorsed and

wounded, the rebels were swarming about

him and on the point of cutting him to

pieces when Capt. Middleton coolly dis-

mounted, placed Fowlis on his horse and

brought him into camp. More devoted

and heroic conduct was never rewarded

by the Victoria Cross. Yet though Mur-

phy received the above decoration in
