At the final summing up of votes under the Canada Temperance Act for the county of Haldimand on 20th inst., the total vote was 2,818, of which 2,063 were against the petition and 1,755 for the petition. There were 18 spoiled ballots and 31 rejected, leaving the majority against the Act 308.
