





Mr. Wells, who seconded the motion, spoke at considerable length in favor of the principle of compensation and maintained that the recognition would assist rather than retard the temperance move.

ject aimed at by the temperance people was one which all right-minded people must favor, did not agree with their methods. He entered upon a long plea in favor of compensation, basing the claims for it on the general principle of justice. He did not believe in prohibition. The Scott Act had proven a failure.
