The Colonel's Idea of a Duel.

Noah's Ark and the Great Eastern.

The following figures concerning the Great Eastern and the Ark are of interest. Somebody is comparing the size and cost of the Great Eastern and Noah's Ark. The cost of building and launching the Great Eastern was \$3,650,000, and this broke the original company. A new company was formed, which spent \$500,000 in fitting and furnishing her. Then this company failed, and a new company was organized with a capital of \$500,000, nearly the whole of which was sunk upon the vessel. Nothing ever built can stand comparison with the Great Eastern, excepting Noah's Ark, and even this vessel could not match her. The length of the ark was 300 cubits, her breadth 50 cubits, and her height 30 cubits. The cubit of the Scriptures, according to Bishop Wilkins, was 21 65-100 inches and computed into English measurement the ark was 547 feet long, 91 feet beam, 54 7-10 feet depth, and 21,762 tons. The Great Eastern is 680 feet long, 83 feet beam, 56 feet depth, and 28,093 tons measurement.
