



After doing so he proceeds as It may be said that the present case is

distinguishable from those cases in this particular, that while in the cases just referred to the streets would be only temporarily interfered with for a few days at a time, and for only short distances in any street at a time, in the present case the encroachments upon the highway by lowering its grade and taking a portion of its width for the railway were permanent appropriations to that extent of the highway.
