

The food given should be of a kind that will produce flesh, and not fat; for the young calf is never fat, and consists

of lean muscle and bone, with scarcely any fat. The food should be laxative, nutritious, easy of digestion, and not bulky. Bran is the best of all foods for this condition of the cow, and cotton seed meal is the worst. A small quantity o new process linseed meal, which is nearly devoid of fat, is excellent, and a daily ration of roots should always be provided. All hard, indigestible, bulky, fermented, sour, mouldy, smutty, or otherwise unwholesome food, should be avoided, not only for the sake of the cow, but for the welfare of the calf which may inherit a tendency to any disorder from which the dam may suffer at this period, especially a tendency to milk fever.
