





It was caused by the breaking of an axle of the forward truck of the second car from the engine. There were 23 cars on the train, six stock, three sleepers, eleven flats, two box and a caboose. Five cars were derailed containing 100 heavy team and band horses. Twenty-seven were killed, 23 bruised and injured. Nine were killed in the first car, five in the second, twelve in the third and one in the remaining two. One buckskin stallion, valued at \$1,000, and eight buckskin band horses were included in the killed. Edward Sharp, of Philadelphia, a pole man, and John Murray, of Waterville, a Maine Central brakeman, were on the car with the broken axle. Sharp was thrown to the earth and pinned beneath the car, where he lay for half an hour and nearly suffocated. He gave up all hopes of life but was finally rescued, and will recover John Murray escaped by running back to the cars in the rear. Blondin, the tight rope walking horse was in one of smashed cars. but escaped unhurt. The horses which survived were led to Waterville by road.
