You will find listening for five minutes much harder than speaking for fifty.

Is it a thing fixed by fate that they should be so tedious? You have time to make them shorter, even short; and in all days never heard I man, woman or child complain of a sermon too long. Well do you know that I regularly accompany my wife and girls to church on Sunday morning; learn further that this I do determined to listen diligently to your discourse. And we happened to be there the first five minutes I am all attention; after a while I am conscious that I have had an illud interval; and when about fifteen minutes have elapsed I find that I have quite given up pulling myself together.
