Jackson, both of Boston, Mass.; No. 67,858 drew Third Prize, \$10,000, also sold in fifths at \$1.00 each: one paid to W. Tonkin, San Jose, Cal., one to G. Rocco, Stockton, Cal., both paid through Wells, Fargo & Co. Express; one to the Anglo-Californian Bank of San Francisco, Cal.; the rest to parties in New York, Nos. 19, 011 and 92,825 drew the two Fourth Prizes \$6,000 each, sold at \$1.00 each.
