



Two only of the 200 lived 18 months. One nurse stated that she took a dead child to the institution every day during the summer months for three years. The dead baby was taken and a living baby handed out in its place. One only of these survived out of the many scores. It is the enormous number of the famishing thus dying or murdered that swells the death rate in Montreal to such frightful proportions.
