Great attention is being given of late to the warming of the liquids given to both calves and pigs. It should never be given to either in winter, or indeed any time at a temperature colder than blood heat. If fed at a colder temperature it is at the expense of feed, and coldwork and coal are cheap factors in heat production than grain or bran.

How Some Maine Fishermen were Punished.
