Change of Creed.  
A New York despatch of June 19 says: Mgr. Boulard was yesterday admitted into the Episcopal church, the formal ceremonies being held at Grace church, in the presence of Bishop Potter. Mgr. Boulard declared his faith in the Episcopal doctrine, and gave his reasons for leaving the Catholic church. There is some talk of making him the first bishop of the Gallican church, in which event he will go to Paris.  
Monsignor Antonine Boulard is a native of France, and is 40 years of age; he was educated in Paris at the University of France, and was for several years the protegee of Cardinal de Lavignerie. He first came to the United States in 1875, and was named a canon of St. Michael the Archangel in 1881. In 1882 he was appointed general president of the Society of the Advocates of St. Peter in North America and the same year was made a member of the Academy of the Arcades in Rome. Mgr. Boulard was further an honorary canon of the Metropolitan church at Rouen, a commander of the order of the Holy Sepulchre, and private chamberlain to his holiness Leo XIII. He had lately been entrusted with the general direction of Peter's peace in North America. For some years past Mgr. Boulard has had charge of the parish of Central Falls, R. I.  
In his letter to the Pope, Monsignor Boulard says he takes this step because he can no longer believe in the doctrines of the syl labus, and the dogmas proclaimed at the last council of the Vatican. Besides, he can no longer admit the pretensions of the Ultramontanes, who wish to exercise absolute authority not only in religious affairs, but also in matters of scientific, philosophical and social character. Mgr. Boulard concludes by saying, that he enters the Episcopalian communion as being more in harmony with his convictions.

**Trained Nurses.**  
A PROFITABLE BUSINESS FOR YOUNG WOMEN GROWING UP.  
The regular rate for the services of a trained nurse is \$20 to \$24 and board per week, writes a New York correspondent, and the demand is brisk enough to employ them on an average of 45 weeks out of the year. Unusually skilled nurses sometimes get \$30 to \$35 per week while undergraduates in their second year's training are permitted to go out at the rate of \$16 a week. What attracts many women to the work is the fact that in most of the hospitals they are paid liberally for their time while learning. This practice is likely to be abolished here, however, as the managers regard the training sufficient recompense for services rendered. The nurses are recruited largely from the ranks of those who would otherwise be milliners or dressmakers, though many highly educated ladies are found among them, attracted by the work, which seems to them especially feminine. Some of the younger nurses become so much interested in the medical end of their duties that, after graduating, they study medicine and become practitioners. The best paying field which has opened before intelligent nurses with organizing and executive ability, however has been, after perfecting themselves, to open training schools on their own account in localities not supplied with such schools. The number of nurses is not equal to the demand yet, but it is increasing so fast that the profession may be overcrowded, like most departments of woman's work.
