

Gloucester County Men Drowned.


An Orono, Me., despatch of 13th inst. says :- "Michael Carwick, aged 20, and John Salter, aged 22, were drowned this evening in the river near the bridge. The two men, accompanied by Carwick's brother, went to swim shortly after supper. Neither knew how to swim. They walked around on the shelving beach, plashing and playing in the water, and gradually went farther into the stream where a ledge stands even with the beach and sheers off into a depth of several feet. Both went over this shelf at the same time. As they sank Carwick's brother ran to try and save them, but the current carried them away, and as he was unable to swim he was compelled to stand

by and see them rise and struggle and then go down for the last time. Their bodies were recovered ha'f an hour after death, a short distance below where they went in. The men were from Gloucester county,






