

HELLOING MADE EASY. HOW IT MAY BE DONE WITH AN AUTOMATIC SWITCHBOARD.

The Merits of Inventor Strowger's Telephone Device Investigated by a Number of Electrical Experts at La Porte, Ind.—The Improvements Claimed.

Out in Englewood, says the Chicago Herald, there lives a white-haired gentleman on whose kindly face the telephone girls will do well to keep a watchful eye. His name is Almon B. Strowger, and he is the inventor of a device which may, when brought to a state of perfection, take away the present employment of the young women Who are the first to greet your ring on Professor Bell's talking machine.

or many years Mr. Strowger's active main has been busy with the prob-lem of automatically connecting the wires over which the human voice is carried from one point to another. Yesterday a large party of invited guests accompanied the inventor and his backers to La Porte, Ind., where the first demonstration of the practical workings of the new appliance is to be seen. The party found a telephone exchange without a single petticoat. It discovered a system whereby one sub-



scriber could secure almost instant telephonic connection with another subscriber, the only formality necessary to produce the result being the manipulation of numbered electric buttons attached to the battery cover of the telephone support. Had all the "hello" girls in christendom been gathered in the exchange not one could have renardent apostle of peace, which some of his countrymen think is an involuntary joke; but it is not so, he wants peace in dered the slightest aid. The invited guests had among their

number representatives of the Scientific American, the Industrial World, the Electrical World, the various heads of electrical companies centered in Chicago, and other expert electricians.

After the guests had been welcomed by the mayor of La Porte, the inventor demonstrated the working of the instrument. As shown in the accompanying picture, five keys form the call connection attached to each subscriber's telephone. They are numbered, commencing at the left, 1,000, 100, 10, 1 and R, respectively, signifying thousands, hundreds, tens, units and "release." Each dreds, tens, units and "release." Each key is connected by wire with the automatic switch in the exchange. If Druggist Brown wanted to call up No. 252 he would press the 100 button twice, the 10 button five times and the unit button twice and then ring the bell. The call and connection is made and the response without delay. There is no calling the number to the "Central" girl and the vexatious delays. There can be no mistake. The little automatic switch clicks into the desired number and holds the into the desired number and holds the wire until the "release" button is pressed, when the line is again thrown

open. No one can interrupt the conversation passing over the line. If Grocer Jones should wish to talk with Druggist Brown while the latter is using the phone, his call, made in the manner set forth, is indicated and the druggist can call him up at his convenience. call him up at his convenience. All the company's guests made several tests, and the device worked to perfection. The La Porte exchange has a subscription list of fifty-two members, but the company has a capacity of eighty. For each machine there must be one automatic switching device. This consists of a brass frame about four inches long, three and a half inches high, and three inches wide, surmounted by a hard rubber disk. Within the frame is the mechanism by means of which the ing of electro-magnets, levers, pawls, authorized to make the choice. He has to the efflicted. connecting arm. units magnet is fastened to the units lever. To this lever is attached a pawl, which pawl engages the rachet teeth of the units wheel. There are 100 rachet teeth in the units wheel. The tens magnet, armature, lever, pawl and rachet wheel are similar to those of the units, as are also those of the hundreds and thousands. The disk is provided with rows of perforations, 100 in each row, corresponding with the ratchet teeth of the units wheel, and as many rows as there are hundreds of subscribers. Through these perforations wire terminals exthese perforations wire terminals extend. Passing through the center of the disk and at right angles thereto is a vertical shaft to which is attached a contact arm extending over the disk to the row of wire terminals. The shaft and

row of wire terminals. The shaft and arm are made to rotate by means of the magnets through the connecting agency of the levers and pawls.

On shelves at the central office are placed the machines, and they occupy a wall space of about 100 square feet. In close proximity to the row of machines a cable or bank of phonic wires trend. The bank wires are also numbered to correspond with the number of the wire terminals and perforations. To each bank wire are attached their respective numbered terminal wire, that is, to No. 1 bank wire are attached No. 1 wire of each disk, there being, of course, as many bank wires as there are wire termany bank wires as there are wire terminals. Like the network of the nervous system, all machines are methodi-cally connected by a network of wires, each having its own peculiar functions

to perform. "Supposing," said one of the most famous of American electricians who accompanied the party, "that this system was introduced in Chicago with a capacity for 9,000 telephones. Then each disk of each switch would be connected with the system by 45,000 wires. The switch for telephone No. 9,001 must have space for 45,005 connections, while all the others must be increased five each so as to have connections with the each so as to have connections with the land


