JAPAN AT THE FAIR

Handiwork and Products of the Oriental Empire. SKILLFUL WORK OF JAPS IN IRON.

An Eagle Which Consumed Five Years in Carving and is Valued at \$10,000.—Fifteen is a Big Stock in Trade in the Country of the Mikado—A Gift to Chicago.

The result is such a display of Japanese handiwork and products as has never before been seen on this continent. Now for the first time large masses of the American people are given the opportunity to see the Oriental work that is really fine.

Some of their ware is surprisingly cheap, other pieces are rather costly. For instance, a small pair of celadon vases sell for \$2.50, but a pair of the same shape and size that are marked \$40.

The liquor ware is here in immense variety. We are all familiar with the wonderful possibilities. Take for example a lacquer screen, in four leaves, set in a base of carved wood and ornamented in gold and painting.

Within the display is the handiwork and most costly ever made by the Japanese at any exposition. At Paris four years ago the empire did well, and attracted much attention, but the exhibit that was neither so comprehensive nor so costly as that which is to be seen here.

It is a pity that we have not seen the variety of ways in which their native skill has been shown. There does not seem to be anything on earth too difficult for their accomplishment. Little truth were known they are great imitators. They do not actually originate one-half the things for which they are given credit.
