ASHOW OF RACES.

Forty Varieties of Mankind in Friendly Rivalry.

SET DAYS FOR FUTURE DISPLAYS.

The Far-Foreign Visitors Are Much More Interesting to Each Other Than to Us—Who Are the Most People on the Grounds, Irish or Swedes?

World's Fair, Aug. 5.—[Special.]—The proper study of mankind is man, says Pope, and here one may take him (including her) in details of every shade of color, shape of face and style of raiment—of the pliancy people come sufficiently near to that. The most northern man here is from latitude 70 degrees or thereabouts, and the most southern from Fata-guina, and as to heat, well, in the fine medium weather now prevailing the Alas-kanian alone excepted, though a few of the black neighbors sit in the sun to rest. Man is certainly here to be studied and man is likewise here to study him.

In colors one may range through forty varieties, from the lily white lady of the Dan to the shining black beauty of the Congo, not to mention the sallow denizen of the Mississippi delta or the Anglo-African-American duke of Chicago. Add to the list those queer burlesques of humanity, the higher anthropoids now on exhibition, and the longest I may add in-kanian, and you have a most interesting and interesting study.

Every body knows by this time that the most colored folks of the Midway place are as a whole the most interesting part of the show taken as a show. That is they interest a larger number of people than any other part of the show.

As aforesaid, the shades of color on the ground are said to number forty, and it is a strange fact that this number goes in pretty close correspondence with the shades. Among the dark people generally it all seems a monotonous turn-ment, and the only variety is in the form or loquacity. Of the three elements of music rhythm and dynamics alone seem present, melody being left out. Experts say that all the negroes are in a state of excitement and they are all in a state of excitement. It is, for all that, a most interesting study.

Down to the first of this month there was a great deal of excitement in the city of Chatham, and some very ludicrous results, as when the newspaper men of Minnesota came on their set day and dedicated the day when President McKinley arrived on the day he had set and found no one to help him dedicate. For a month or so there was scarcely a building dedicated, and the "Miramichi" passengers for the day were not very numerous. The advertisement of a state was too busy on the state's day or something else was going on in the city, and sometimes the people of a certain class or industry were uninterested as to their day. But now, the administration declares with great positiveness, that all that is provided for hereafter the public may rely on seeing each display on the day announced for it.

Among the most important are the following: Friday, Aug. 9, Wheelman's Day, the 15th, Bohemian Gymnastic Union Day, the 16th, May 16th, Indiana the 23d, Illinois the 24th, and the colored people the 25th. In September almost every day will have its specialty and some of them will be made of great historic interest. California will on the 1st, celebrate the day when President Fillmore signed the act making that the thirty-first state, thus reversing the original thirteen in the Union's number. The 11th is set as "Silver Day," but it will not be anything like a festival. To "The Veterans" will be given four days, the 11th to the 14th. Mexico promises a magnificent display on the 15th. Nevada, Colorado and Montana will celebrate their admission days and "Ireland," including the Irish in America and elsewhere, will close the month in a kind of patriotic exhibition, incidentally celebrating the passage of the 11th's home rule bill as they find by holding their own day, and as the active will ever last. CAIN'S RIVER AND TRIBUTARIES.

The subscriber begs to direct the attention of all persons concerned to the following extract from the Act of Assembly passed 15th April 1893, entitled An Act to Further Amend the Fisheries Act 1854:

"Section 10 of 'The Fisheries Act, 1854' is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:—

"10. Any person trespassing upon the Fishery of any riparian proprietor or person occupying under him, and any person fishing in the waters of any lake without permission of the owner or lessee thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five cents nor more than one dollar for each offence which may be recovered by any Justice of the Peace for the County in which the offence is committed, and in default of payment of such fine and costs of prosecution, shall be liable to imprisonment in the common jail of the County, for a term not exceeding thirty days."

The provisions of the foregoing section of the law will hereafter be enforced against any and all persons who may be found trespassing or to have trespassed upon the waters of Cain's river and its tributaries, which are under lease from the government of New Brunswick to the subscriber J. M. RUDDOCK. Chatham, N. B., May 1, 1893.

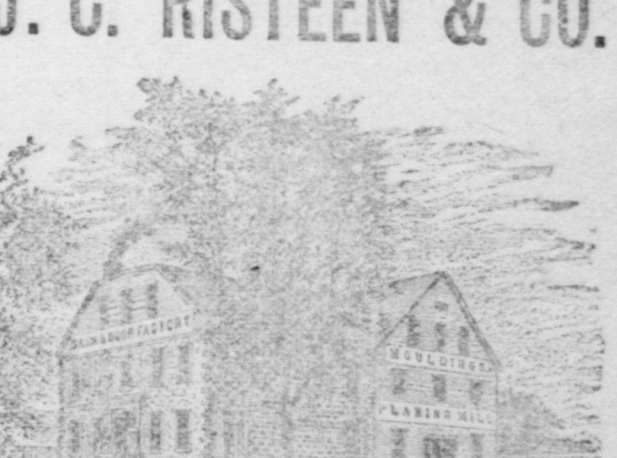
