(From Providence Journal, Nov. 21.) A short time since Dr. Snow, the Superintendent of Health, received information from the Rev. Father Hughes, of St. Patrick's Church, of the existence of a genuine case of Eastern leprosy in this city, and took measures to relieve the community from the danger of its presence here. The victim of the disease was a girl of French extraction, 19 years of age, and who came here from a French village called Tracadie, in the northern part of New Brunswick. The girl has lived in the city two or three years, living as a servant in several dfferent families, during which time the disease has rapidly developed, until it has reached a very advanced stage. Her family are pipe, Single and Double barrelled Guns, well known as subjects of the disease in the place from which she came, and the clergyman of the village, Father Babineau, kindly furnished information concerning her to Father Hughes, and advised that she be sent back as soon as possible. Arrangements were accordingly made, with the assistance of Father Hughes, to send her back. She was provided with warm clothing, and under the charge of a careful officer was sent to her home last week and delivered to the authorities there. The officer has returned, and has brought the following letter, which explains the case,
