Behind this, the mountains rise to an approximate elevation of one thousand feet affording, though steep, excellent pasturage to the very summits. Looking up, the bed'of the Restigouche assumes almost the character of a gorge; abrupt descents and steep inclines end at the water's edge. The north side of the Metapediac is one huge wall but the south is more broken and accesible.
