

It may be that his brow is serene, his countenance open and calm. Don't trust him. Whilst you are laughingly enjoying yourself with good company, or contemplating the bold outline of some lofty, hill reflected in the depths of the water, with one breath from his mountain

as pitiless as himself. MOUNTAIN AND RIVER. Immediately back of Campbellton is a comparatively bad tract. This rises more abruptly as it recedes from the river till, finally, at a distance of five or six miles, it merges into a ridge almost of an equal altitude with the "Sugar Loaf."
