



My impression at present is that in whichever of the two Legislatures the jurisdiction may ultimately be found to lie, legislation in the first place should be in the direction of making your Permissive Bill better adapted for this purpose than it seems to be at present (hear, hear, and loud cheers), and whenever the country seems to be ready for further advances in that matter, no doubt the Legislature of the time, and the Ministry of the time, will prove themselves equal to the occasion. (Cheers.) It is a serious thing for a Minister to pronounce dogmatically at this stage of the temperance question what shape legislation may take in a few years; but I can say this much, that my colleagues and I take the deepest interest in the matter, and shall endeavor
