and at the same time prevent parties cutting the timber of the land without giving to the country the benefit of settlement of its Crown Lands as designed by the liberal policy of these Acts.

Editorial Correspondence. FREDERICTON, Feb. 14th. This morning Mr. Willis gave notice of a motion for more papers. This time he is after copies of all correspondence, minutes of Council and statements of claims either in connection with the continuance of the Dominion subsidy of \$83,000, or any other allowance or claim remaining unadjusted.

THE TIMBER DEBTS. The experience of the past year in the administration of the Timber Regulations of July, 1874, has been very satisfactory. The numerous objections made against these regulations at the time of their adoption have not been met in the practical conduct of this Branch of the Crown Land Department. By many it was contended that collections of stumpage could not be made and the country would again experience losses similar to those which occurred under the sale of land on credit. The fact, however, that the gross stumpage for two years has been \$131,261.84 and that this sum is all collected, except the sum of \$2,021.73 is a most complete contradiction to the objection, and may be fairly regarded as one of the most satisfactory features in the Timber Regulations.

CONSTITUTIONAL QUEEN. Hon. Mr. McQueen is considered by many as being next to the Speaker himself - the "May" of the House. Today Mr. Willis rose to move his resolution for an address to His Honor, calling for the "Maritime Union" papers, when Mr. McQueen said the hon. gentleman was not in order. He should remember that though the Address had been passed, the Committee had not yet, so far as the House was informed, waited upon His Honor with it, and it was therefore certain that His Honor was not, constitutionally, aware of the existence of Mr. Willis. Mr. Willis saw the point, laughed pleasantly and doubtless realizes that he "owes Mr. McQueen one."

THE "MARTIME UNION" PAPERS. The Report shows satisfactory progress under the Free Grants Act and contains a large amount of statistical and other information to which I shall doubtless refer in future correspondence.

THE STRENGTH OF PARTIES. In the House appears to be sixteen and, possibly, seventeen on Opposition side and twenty-three or twenty-four on Government side.

THE LAWYERS. A. H. Johnson, Esq., was enrolled as a barrister here to-day and leaves for Chatham to-morrow morning. Mr. Lawler, of Newcastle, who is in partnership with M. Adams Esq., has had his examination papers recommended to the judges and will, no doubt, be admitted as an attorney in a few days.

MR. THOMSON'S REPORT. Mr. Thomson, Q. C., made some offensive remarks concerning Judge Weldon in the House on Friday. Mr. Thomson seems to presume on his acknowledged ability and is apt to travel "without the record" at times in a manner which may yet secure for him a commitment for contempt of court.

MR. BURNS GAVE NOTICE OF ENQUIRY whether Government at any time since the opening of last session has withdrawn any portion of amount then lying to the credit of the Province with the Dominion Government and understood as being reserved for the construction of the Albert Railway, and if so, the date or dates of such withdrawal.

INSURANCE OF MORTGAGES. Mr. Murdoch committed a Bill to secure the interest of mortgages in insurance on real estate. Mr. Ryan of Gloucester is in the chair. The principal provision of the Bill, which was explained at length by the mover, is that when the mortgagee and mortgagor shall agree thereto, the mortgagee shall, by serving notice on the Secretary or Agent of the insurance company in which insurance on the property is effected, have, in case of loss, a first lien on either the whole
