In the Missionary Review of the World Rev H H Jessup of Beirut, Syria, considers the subject of the number of Jews in Palestine He answers with an emphatic "No" the question, "Is it true that the Jews are flocking back to the land of their fathers by thousands and tens of thousands, and that soon they will take possession of Canaan, restore their kingdom and rebuild their temple?"
