NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF TIMBER LICENSES. The attention of all holders of Timber Licenses is called to Section 19 of the Timber Regulations, which reads as follows:—

19 No Spruce or Fir trees shall be cut by any Licensee under any License, not even for piling, which will not make a log at least 12 feet in length, and ten inches at the small end, and if any such shall be cut, the Licensee shall be liable to double stampage and all Licenses are hereby notified that, for the future, the provisions of this section will be rigidly enforced.
