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Town Council

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MR. FROST'S OFFER

The Mayor read the offer of Mr. Sheppard Frost to take charge of the steam fire engines and street work for \$400 a year, the Town to provide fuel, oil, and also fresh water when the engines are pumping from the river; and another offer from Mr. Frost to add the duties of Town marshal to the other two for \$600 a year.

BOARD OF HEALTH.

The Mayor also read a communication from Mr. D. G. Smith declining to serve as a member of the Board of Health, to which he was appointed at the last meeting of Council.

AN EXTRA POLICEMAN WANTED.

His Worship, referring to the proposal to appoint a Town marshal said it seemed to him that such an official was not necessary. Last year, it was understood that a third policeman would be appointed for a part of the year, at least, to do duty in the lower part of the Town, and he desired to impress upon the Council the urgent need of such an appointment, because of the rowdiness prevalent there.

THE FIRE ENGINEER MATTER.

Ald. Murdoch reported from the committee appointed for the purpose that they had made enquiries of Mr. J. M. Ruddock respecting the capabilities of Messrs. Calvin Craig and Hiram Maltby for taking charge of the Town steam fire engines.

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Ald. Watt said that four inch iron piles could now be bought for \$30 per thousand feet. This was received with expressions of interest in some quarters.
