A USEFUL STOCKING BAG.

In every household the stockings that require mending accumulate very fast A stocking bag in which to keep all those that need attention is a very useful thing for every housewife to have and from an exchange we take following description of such a bag that is very easily made:

Take a yard of pretty cretonne, with a small figure; three yards of satin ribbon an inch wide, to match the cretonne in color, a small piece of white flannel, some stiff pasteboard and a spool of silk. Cut four circular pieces of the pasteboard, each one seven inches in diameter. You may cut them out by a large saucer or a bread and butter plate. Cover these pieces smoothly with cretonne and overhand them two together, as if for a pocket pincushion, with the sewing silk.

The puff should be a straight piece of cretonne six inches long and twelve inches wide. Turn in the edges on the sides of this strip and gather to fit the circular pieces, to which the strip must be neatly overhauled.
