Potato Omelet.—To a cupful of mashed potato allow three eggs; you may add four or five, but three will do; the yolks and whites should be beaten separately, as they will be so much lighter in that case; an even teaspoonful of salt, half a teaspoonful of milk, and a very little sifted flour not more than a heaping teaspoonful, complete the ingredients, with the exception of the flavoring.
