#### PLANS A GREAT RAILROAD.

Cecil Rhodes Would Connect Cape Town and Caire by a British-Egyptian Line. Mr. Cecii Rhodes, known throughout he civilized world as a speculator of

stupendous ideas, has again indulged sort of day dream. He has sprung the British and South African publics many startling schemes, some o which, as his bank account would doubtless show, have been surprisingly successful. He now comes to the front, however, with a project so far surpassing all of his previous games that with the possible exception of the plans of the De Lesseps, it may be said to be without a parallel in latter day engineering. It is no less than to build a line of railroad from Cape Town
