BACTERIA IN SOILS.

The new theory of inoculating the soil with cultures of bacteria for special crops is a German discovery, and so far as tests have been made success has attended the experiments. With the opening of the new year of 1899 there will be opportunities for farmers the several stations, and as the cost is terested in making discoveries with the Northern and London and Northwestuse of the "commercial bacteria." Already the dairymen of this country have accepted these minute agents as adjuncts to success in the production of choice butter, and scientists have discovered tthat bacteria perform special functions in the growth of all

One of the easiest modes of experiment with bacteria is for farmers to procure soil from other farms. On a field where one farmer endeavored for years to grow clover, without success was applied four bushels of top soil from a field which had grown a luxuriant crop of clover. The result was almost miraculous, as the field which had been used without success produced a magnificent crop. It had all the elements of fertility for clover, and was capable of giving a large yield, but was lacking in the micro-organisms necessary for converting the plant food of the soil into forms best adapted to the desired crop.



An Instrument that Demonstrates There i no Silence:

There is no such thing as silence. What man calls silence includes all noises below the limit at which the LEAD PACKACEShuman ear will register sound; but silence is really full of sounds that

This interesting fact has just been revealed by an instrument invented by

The device can photograph any sound from the roar of an explosion passing through a room.

The machine consists of a set of moveable mirrors and prisms which act in conjunction with a diaphragm. The slightest sound will cause this diaphragm to vibrate. On the inner side of the diaphragm is attached a

very small circular mirror weighing a fraction of a gram. When a sound, however slight, enters the resonator or receiver of the instrument, the diaphragm, and consequently the small mirror, vibrate backward and forward, and a small beam of light is sent careering about among the other mirrors and the prisms, and s made finally to resolve itself into a series of colored fringes. These fringes are projected through

series of slits in a screen, until by graphic plate, it takes the form of a waving line. This waving line is projected on a screen by means of a lantern, and may be viewed if necessary by a number of


