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Certain Philadelphians, so far from joining in the cry against Great Britain which is so marked a feature of American politics, have formed a society composed of many men powerful in the financial and political world, who pledge themselves to form an open alliance with that country.

A unique method of cheating the postal revenues and thereby saving a few cents has been reported to the Post Office Department here from Niagara Falls, N. Y. That city has a good many English people for residents, while it is annually visited by thousands of tourists from the British Isles.

According to a story which comes from Seattle, there is great indignation in southern Alaska over the temporary boundary line as laid down by the international surveyors between Canada and the United States, which has placed in Canadian territory the northern half of the porcupine mining district which has been held by Americans for years, and the title to which, it is claimed, has never been contested.

The petitioners represent that the modus vivendi has permitted the British to seize thousands of acres of the public domain containing rich deposits of gold. All of the Klakheena River and Glacier and Boulder Creeks, upon which Americans have spent thousands of dollars in prospecting, are taken away from rightful proprietors.

There was probably no European more qualified to express an opinion of the Chinese than Colonel Gordon, more commonly called General Gordon, whose strange career closed at Khartoum in January, 1885.

The danger of such an outbreak, Gordon said, became greater every year on account of the way the Chinese were being continually harassed by the European States with demands for compensation, in some cases just, in others quite frivolous.

Speaking of the authorities, Gordon said a mandarin was never to be trusted, and he was only too glad when he left their service. The English, in his opinion, made the mistake of thinking they were welcome wherever they went, but in fifteen or twenty years they would find proof to the contrary.

London, July 30.—Shanghai despatches to the Daily Telegraph say that Li Hung Chang was questioned yesterday. He declares the Emperor, Empress Dowager, and foreign ministers are all safe but he has no more compunction than before an oriental for the condition of the men and children in Peking.

It is obvious now that the object of Li Hung Chang's visit to Shanghai is to sow discord among the allies who met with success. A municipal meeting has been convened for Tuesday for the purpose of re-organizing the defence of Shanghai.
