[Telegraph of 15th.] In recognition of his services to Canadian soldiers in South Africa, Mr. R. Scuart Solomon, of Cape Town, was on Saturday publicly granted the freedom of St. John. The honor was conferred by Mayor Daniel at a special meeting of the common council Saturday morning in the chamber at the court house. In calling the meeting to order Mayor Daniel said it was a very pleasant duty to
