

FIRE AT THE DOYLE MILL :--- The Doyle (formerly the Kerr) mill, about a mile above Douglastown, was reported to be on fire on Tuesday and the Snowball Company's steamer, St. George, with a lot of town hose, accompanied by Capt. Burke, ald. Hocken, ex-alderman Burr and some Chatham fire men, went up. Before their arrival a hand engine and hose from Newcastle had reached the spot and had water on for some time doing very effective service. The fire was not in the mill but in a pile of laths west of and 150 feet or more distant from it. The St. George got two streams on to assist the Newcastle and local men and amongst them they soon had the fire subdued.






