NEWS AND NOTES. General DeWet, who is travelling through Germany, addressed a crowd from a car window at Hanover Station, clad in his night shirt.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). The Canadian Club of Boston has invited Hon. H. A. McKenna to be present at a banquet which the club is to give at the Coppy Square Hotel in November, as one of the speakers on the Progress and Development of Canada.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). The Sultan of Morocco's vigorous action in dealing with the murderer of Missionary Cooper was due to the discovery of a plot to murder all Europeans in Fez. This plot would have been carried out by a mob arising from the Sultan's own ranks.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). The London Daily Mail says that it understands that the government will ask parliament to vote a grant of \$10,000,000 for the benefit of the residents of the Transvaal who remained loyal to Great Britain during the war in South Africa.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). The British Admiralty has given out contracts for the construction of three warships described as "scouts." They will have a speed of 23 1/2 knots when in fighting trim.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). Wm. Mackenzie, president of the Toronto Railway Company, himself a Presbyterian, has given Trinity (Anglican) University ten entrance bursaries of \$100 each to be given as far as practicable to Presbyterian students.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). Twelve election petitions were dismissed at Toronto on Saturday. They were against Conservatives in Addington, West Hamilton, East Hamilton, Mantoulin, Algona, South Huron, Against Liberals: Stormont, South West, West Huron, South Norfolk, South Bruce and Centre Simcoe. It was a general sweep-off.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). Andrew Carnegie has offered the town of Truro \$10,000 for a public library building on condition that the town raise \$1,000 a year for its maintenance. The offer came to Mr. Carnegie before his resignation.

NEWS AND NOTES (continued). The Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom has passed the following resolution: "That having considered the reported probability of a large subsidy being granted for a fast mail service and also for the service of large freight steamers between Canada and England, we do protest strongly against any subsidies or other assistance to shipping by the British government unless they are confined solely to the ship and when he jumped on the mate and tried to strike him down he pulled Lyman off him.
